## **Exam Question**

## Topic: Arc Length

Calculate the length of the curve given by

$$x = t^2, y = 2t, (0 \le t \le 1).$$

Give your answer both in exact form and also as an approximation rounded to four decimal places, using your calculator.

## Solution

$$L = \int_0^1 \sqrt{x'(t)^2 + y'(t)^2} dt = \int_0^1 \sqrt{4t^2 + 4} dt = 2 \int_0^1 \sqrt{t^2 + 1} dt$$

Let  $t = \sinh u$ ;  $dt = \cosh u \ du$ .

$$L = \int_0^{\sinh^{-1} 1} 2 \cosh^2 u \, du$$

$$= \int_0^{\sinh^{-1} 1} (1 + \cosh 2u \, du)$$

$$= \left[ u + \frac{\sinh 2u}{2} \right]_0^{\sinh^{-1} 1}$$

$$= \left[ u + \sinh u \cosh u \right]_0^{\sinh^{-1} 1}$$

$$= \sinh^{-1} 1 + 1 \cdot \cosh \left( \sinh^{-1} 1 \right)$$

$$= \sinh^{-1} 1 + \sqrt{1 + \sinh^2 \left( \sinh^{-1} 1 \right)}$$

$$= \sinh^{-1} 1 + \sqrt{2} = 2.2956 \, (4 \, d.p.)$$
